- Untreated bed sores are a sign of elder neglect.
- Untreated bed sores should be documented (take pictures & describe).

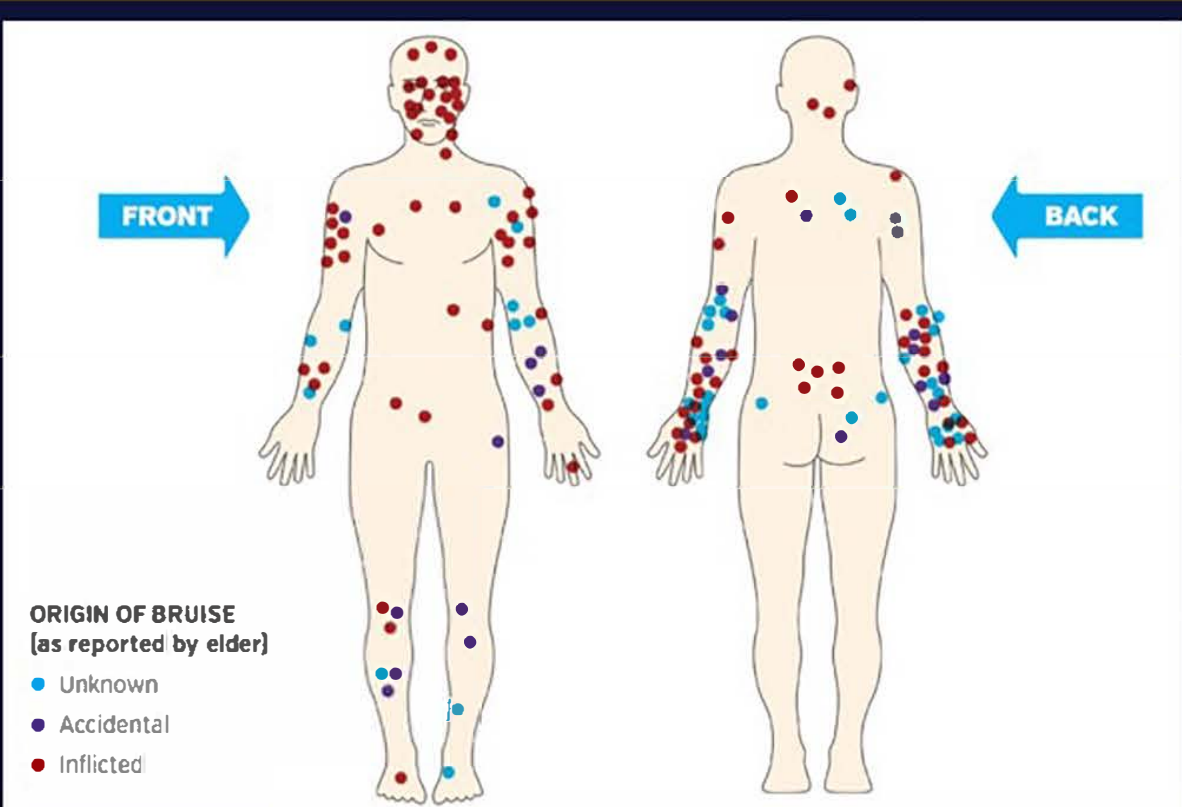
Elder Abuse and Neglect Documentation Tool
